Field Day Update:

The 2008 ARRL Field Day is June 28 and 29 this year. As in the last few years SVARA is planning on participating again at Richland Township Park. If you have never participated this will be a great year to start, and for all you SVARA Field Day veterans, welcome back.

Since 1933, North American Hams have been setting aside a weekend in June to get together and practice their emergency setup and contesting skills. This annual happening has become the most popular amateur radio operating event, with the object being to contact as many stations as we can during the 24 hour period. One-half an emergency preparedness demonstration and one-half a radio operating contest, Field Day is a challenging, skill developing, bonding and just plain fun time.

We welcome everyone to participate whether it be to set up your own Field Day station, help to operate, be there to act as a host or hostess, help with food, and one of the most important things; to help with set up and tear down Saturday morning and Sunday afternoon.

There are quite a few changes to the rules this year especially to the GOTA (Get on the Air) station. Other changes for 2008 include the Demonstration Mode Bonus category being eliminated and replaced by an Educational Activity Bonus worth 100 points Download the Field Day packet to get all the changes. http://www.arrl.org/contests/forms/fd-2008-packet.pdf

If you would like to set up a station there are lots of possibilities. The stations we have spoken for are: 40 meter phone, 15 meter phone and CW, 20 meter phone (the club trailer), 10 meter phone, and 20 meter digital and CW. That leaves a lot of frequencies and modes that can be utilized such as 160 meter phone and CW/digital, 80 meter phone and CW/digital, 40, 15 and 10 meter CW/digital, and a VHF/UHF station.

We can always use volunteers to help with setup and teardown, to man the information booth, to organize the Saturday evening potluck, to round up youngsters for the new youth element bonus, and many other things. And, of course, feel free to just come out and hang around. Every year we get people who stop by out of curiosity and look around. EC Corner - April 2008

Now that Spring is here, that means that severe weather season is not far behind. Predictions from the National Weather Service state a higher then normal chance for severe weather in Michigan. "La Nina will stick around for Spring and will provide normal to above normal temperatures and precipitation". "The last time we had a La Nina like this, we had the 1965 Palm Sunday outbreak of tornados" said Mark Torregrossa of TV25. So now is the time to prepare.

One opportunity is the **NWS Skywarn training**. This training session will be held on **April 10 at 7:00 p.m. at Covenant Cooper Lecture Theater**. If you want to keep your Skywarn card current and be able to participate in Skywarn weather events, you will need to attend this session. This includes <u>all ARES members</u>, but non ARES members are encouraged to participate as well.

Do you know when severe weather is threading your area? A good weather radio with S.A.M.E technology is a must. These can be purchased for as little at \$20 from local Kroger stores, Radio Shack and many other electronic retailers. These new radios will provide <u>county specific</u> weather information and sound an alert if severe weather it predicted in your area. This will provide that extra margin of time to allow you and your family to seek shelter.

Another thing you can do is prepare your home and family for emergencies. Did you know that the *Saginaw County office of Emergency Management* and *Saginaw County Health Department* are sponsoring a "Get Ready Saginaw County' program? This program is designed to get you and your family ready for any type of emergency. The program gives twelve monthly steps to Citizen Preparedness. A Skywarn Net Control training session and tabletop exercise will be conducted for all Skywarn trained members at the Red Cross Building on Michigan Avenue, at 7:00 pm, April 24th. The exercise will include Net Control operations, proper reporting techniques, what to report and when, and other useful information. Members will need to attend the April 10th NWS Spring 2008 Skywarn training being held at Covenant Cooper Lecture Theater (4/10/2008, 6:30 pm) in order to participate in this training and exercise. This spring looks to be an active weather season, so please mark the dates on your calendar and plan to attend both events.
