QRM from Dave, N8ERL

As this is written, the SVARA testing session on Saturday, February 25 was a big success. 19 hams upgraded or got their ham license. Good job to Keith, N8XD, and his team for a well-run and well-organized event.

April 21 and 22 is the Michigan QSO party. State QSO parties are a fine way to get a taste of contesting without having a lot of experience. A State QSO party usually runs over a weekend for about 12 or more hours, usually has fairly simple scoring, exchanges and categories and is a lot of fun.

The Michigan QSO party begins at 1600Z on Saturday and ends at 0400 Sunday (12 hours). Participants get one point for SSB contacts, two points for CW contacts, and stations may be worked once per band. Multipliers (for Michigan contesters) are Michigan counties, the other 49 states and the Canadian provinces. You get points for DX contacts but no multipliers. One of the very fun parts of a QSO party is going mobile or portable. Mobile, to give participants the chance to work you in a different county. Portable, to go to a rare county (the details are at the MIQP website http://www.miqp.org/).

Even if you only work the contest for a little while, you are helping folks get points. There were only a few of us from Saginaw County last year so it would be great to have more participation. Also, there is a club plaque so when you send in your logs make sure you enter as a SVARA member.

Speaking of logs, N3FJP, Scott, the author of the famous *Amateur Contact Log* has a MI QSO party log which is quite inexpensive. It can be found at his site http://www.n3fjp.com/.

The Marshall Swap and Shop is coming up on Saturday March 17. This is usually a pretty good swap. All of you new upgrades will no doubt find some HF radios for sale (it will be interesting to see if all the new general and extras will drive up used gear prices). There will also be some dealers there for new gear also.

Don't forget that Dayton (yeaaaaa!) is coming up in May. The date is May 18 through 20. If you haven't been to the Dayton Hamfest, you ought to make this your year.
