- 5. Bob, N8YXR, and Jenny, KC0RBV, 20 meters-175 QSO's and 175 points
- 6. Dave, N8ERL, 40 meters-243 QSO's and 270 points
- 7. Mike, KD8AUZ, 80 meters-122 QSO's and 162 points
